Why Genealogy?

- It would be nice to know
- It would be nice for the kids
- I would like to know more about _____
- To preserve family traditions for future generations
- To learn or preserve cultural or ethnic history
- Knowing family medical history may help in the battle against genetic disease or defects

- To qualify for a lineage or heritage society
- To qualify for enrollment into a Native America tribe
- To write and publish your family history
- To discover that unique fact or solve a family puzzle
- To verify family lore

Where Do I Begin

- Start with yourself, the add what you know about your parents, grandparents
 - full name
 - date and place of birth
 - -date and place of marriage
 - names of children
 - -date and place of death
- Record what you already know

- Review family records at home
- Talk to relatives
- Record everything, even if you don't think you will need it
- Always document when and where you obtained the information
- Get photocopies if possible; Take pictures
- Use charts

Tips

- Talk to your relatives
- Cite your sources; make photocopies of everything and take pictures
- Question all information
- Information found on the internet must be verified
- Family legends must be questioned
- You're probable not descended from royalty or related to some famous
- Try multiple spellings of your surname
- Dig deeper, go past names and dates
- Beware of generic family history

What am I looking for?

Recorded evidence of the existence of a person (related to them or not), and facts about the person and that person's relationship(s) with others.

Organization

- Organize your files and records from the beginning – Start organized and stay organized
 - Notebooks
 - File Folders
 - Electronic
- Store originals separate from your working files
- Use charts

Talk is Cheap


In 1980 a 3 minute call on the weekend cost about a \$1 (or about \$2.40 in today's dollars)

- Today most cell phones have nationwide calling
- Cheaper: VOIP
- Cheaper: Skype or Google Hangouts
- Have you looked at gasoline prices the last couple of weeks, go visit a relative and talk genealogy (September 2015)

Keeping Notes Can Be Cheap

- Pencil and Paper Okay
- Do you have a computer, tablet or smart phone that travels with you, then consider Evernote, Microsoft OneNote, Google Keep
- Use your cell phone's features such as voice recording and camera
